Innovations on Cervical Cancer Screening: A Systematic Review

Cervical cancer stands as the fourth most prevalent cancer among women worldwide and second in Bangladesh. However, when detected at the precursor stage, it is treatable. Therefore, identifying accessible screening methods, tools, and innovations in screening tests, processes, and implementation is crucial for prevention. Recently a systematic review under AdSEARCH investigated the innovations in screening for the prevention and early diagnosis of cervical cancer and their effectiveness. In light of this, a dissemination seminar on 'Innovations to Improve Cervical Cancer

Screening: A Systematic Review' has been organised at icddr,b. The seminar commenced with a welcome address by

Dr Quamrun Nahar. Later on,

Dr Fatema Khatun, Principal Investigator (PI) of the study, along with **Farina Naz** shared the study findings.

The systematic review encompassed six major databases (including MEDLINE, CINAHL, Web of Science, EMBASE, Scopus, and the Cochrane Library) with specific inclusion criteria covering various study designs, studies with innovations and women aged 18-64 years. The review findings looked into innovations

considering medical devices, laboratory techniques, strategies and combined techniques and innovations to identify and detect cervical cancer. Farzana Sultana, Dr Momena Khatun, Dr Ashrafunnessa, Dr A.N.M Mostofa Kamal, and Dr Md. Azizul Alim gave their remarks. They stated that the review will help identify future practices and strategies for improving cervical cancer screening. UN representatives, INGO and NGO bodies, academics, and experts in this arena were present at the seminar and provided feedback.

Discussions during the workshop spanned various aspects including marriage, sexual health, pregnancy, gender-based violence and respective study addressed specific organisational challenges. The study leads proposed practical solutions with their collective expertise. The workshop concluded with a resolute commitment to ongoing collaboration on initiatives aimed at improving women's health.

The 'Two Finger Test (TFT) Ban Study Advisory Group Meeting' convened at icddr.b where **Dr Ruchira Tabassum** Naved, PI of the study moderated the session. Currently, AdSEARCH is undertaking a research project titled "A Qualitative Assessment of Implementation of the Two-Finger Test Ban in Medico-Legal Evidence Collection for Rape in Selected Health Facilities in Bangladesh". The study aims to explore the implementation status of the High

Court ban on the two-finger test in medico-legal examinations of rape cases. This assessment encompasses the knowledge, attitudes, and practices of relevant stakeholders from the health, legal, and NGO sectors regarding the TFT and its ban. During the session, Nahida **Akte**r presented the study's preliminary findings. Civil Surgeon of Dhaka, DGHS, representatives from GAC, GIZ, BLAST, Ipas Bangladesh, UNFPA, BRAC, BSMMU, DMCH, and UNFPA attended the session and provided valuable feedback during the discussion.

Nutri-CAP study meets the Community Representatives

Year after year, nearly 100,000 people from Bauniabadh, nestled in Dhaka's Mirpur area, have been enduring the hardships of inadequate access to clean water and proper sanitation. To address this Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) and nutrition issue, AdSEARCH has been conducting an ongoing Nutrition for Children, Adolescent Girls, and Pregnant Women (Nutri-CAP) study in this area. The study aims to establish a

model for developing and implementing sustainable nutrition service delivery platforms for the urban poor in Dhaka. A dissemination session on 'Informing current activities of the study, and Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) situation in the Bauniabadh slum' was held at icddr, b where the discussion focused on ongoing Nutri-CAP studies in the area, with a special emphasis on nutrition WASH initiatives. **Dr Mustafa Mahfuz**. the

PI of the study delivered a presentation on the study's progress and shared key findings regarding the existing WASH situation in the study site. **Begum** Meherunnesa Haque attended the discussion as a guest, along with religious leaders and community representatives from the Bauniabadh area, alongside the study investigators and AdSEARCH team members.

A Discussion Session on the Importance of a Comprehensive **Registry System in Combatting Obstetric Fistula**

25 March 2024



AdSEARCH has organised an expert panel discussion session emphasising the crucial role of a registry system in documenting information and monitoring health programmes, with the potential to significantly reduce cases of obstetric fistula. The session commenced with a welcome speech delivered by **Prof.** Dr Sayeba Akhter. Later on, Dr Lubna Hossain provided an overview of national registries on Maternal, Newborn, and Child Health (MNCH). Md. Ashraful

Alam demonstrated the data-capturing platform for fistula services, highlighting its significance in streamlining information management. Dr Ahmed Ehsanur Rahman led a session on the development of the Fistula Register, shedding light on the strategies to enhance its efficacy and accessibility. The workshop concluded with an open discussion, allowing participants to exchange insights and address pertinent concerns. Prominent gynaecologists of

the country, GoB representatives, UN bodies representatives, NGO/INGO's representatives and experts were present at the workshop. Anisuddin Ahmed concluded the proceedings with a vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to all stakeholders for their contributions and participation.

Furthermore, with technical support from AdSEARCH, MAMM's Institute of Fistula and Women's Health (MIFWOH) is conducting one of the largest community-based household surveys in Bangladesh considering more than 60,000 women of reproductive age with a birth history as participants of the survey. AdSEARCH is contributing to the development of a digital registrar system to strengthen the documentation for obstetric fistula and the expert panel session has been organised to advance the study.
