Experts Gathered to Finalise BCC Materials for Countrywide Trial of Menstrual Health and Hygiene

23 April 2025





Over 50% of Bangladeshi women and girls use cloths as menstrual absorbents, and the maintenance of cloth as menstrual absorbents is suboptimal, which leads to urogenital infections. However, menstruating women and girls are given little choice, as the sanitary pads available in the market are costly. With support from Global Affairs Canada (GAC), one of the AdSEARCH innovations is assessing the feasibility of introducing a locally made disposable *cloth pad* named Sultana icddr,b Reuseable Cloth Pad (SiRCP) and Sultana washer and dryer bag. As a study activity, the Menstrual Health and Hygiene (MHH) Advisory Group Meeting was held at icddr,b to finalise the Behavior Change Communication (BCC) materials for an MHH Cluster Randomised Controlled Trial (CRCT) in Bangladesh health systems. The meeting served as a milestone in aligning technical insights before launching the intervention phase. This innovation is led by icddr,b in collaboration with DGFP, DGHS, CBHC, iDE Bangladesh, and RHSTEP, and is aiming to evaluate the intervention's efficacy and effectiveness through routine menstrual

health and family welfare programmes of Government of Bangladesh. The meeting brought together around 20 key stakeholders, including representatives from the government officials of DGHS, DGFP and Community-Based Healthcare (CBHC) services. The finalised SBCC materials, including a training manual and flipchart, will support efforts to strengthen menstrual health programms for adolescent girls and women in selected regions of the country.

icddr,b presents "Thermal Jacket" at the 7th International Conference of BNF

At the 7th International Conference of Bangladesh Neonatal Forum (BNF) 2025, icddr,b has presented the initial findings from a clinical trial of the "Thermal Jacket", an innovation partially supported by AdSEARCH, designed to manage hypothermia in preterm or low birth-weight neonates, especially in resource-limited settings. **Fariya Rahman**, Research Investigator of MCHD, icddr,b, along with other researchers, showcased the early outcomes of the trial. The presentation highlighted the use of Thermal Jacket as a supplement to Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) to enhance the thermal care uptake by the neonates in need. Moreover, the preliminary result also reveals that, Thermal Jacket is as efficacious as KMC to maintain normal body temperature and effective to improve thermal care uptake time manifolds when given in the intervals of two KMC sessions. The Thermal Jacket has been developed by the scientists of icddr,b in collaboration with Johns Hopkins University and George Mason University, USA.



Dhaka University's ISRT Students Visit icddr,b's Matlab HDSS

A group of 49 MSc students and four faculty members from the Institute of Statistical Research and Training (ISRT), University of Dhaka, visited the Health and Demographic Surveillance System (HDSS) site in Matlab, Chandpur of icddr,b. Organised by AdSEARCH by icddr,b, the field visit aimed to provide hands-on exposure to real-world Public Health surveillance and research practices. Dr Md. Al Fazal Khan, delivered an overview of the HDSS, discussing its historical development, key functions, and contributions to health policy at both national and global levels. Participants joined a guided tour of the field site, led by Md. Bashiruddin Ahmed, where they observed data collection methods, interacted with field staff, and explored the use of digital tools in long-term demographic surveillance.

The group also visited Matlab Hospital to see how research and surveillance data inform clinical services, particularly in maternal and child health. The visit offered valuable practical insights into the integration of research, data, and healthcare delivery in rural Bangladesh.

Development and Testing of a Mobile App on Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) of Adolescents in Rural Bangladesh

Adolescents aged 10–19 face significant knowledge gaps on SRH, often due to a lack of open discussion in families, limited content in school curricula, and discomfort among teachers in addressing these topics. To shed light on this, AdSEARCH has initiated the study titled, "Development and Testing of a Mobile App on Sexual and Reproductive Health of Adolescents in Rural Bangladesh" to develop and test a mobile app covering SRHR information for adolescents. The study is led by **Dr Quamrun Nahar**, Head of Research, Maternal and Child Health Division, icddr,b.

To review the app's content on adolescent

SRH, a workshop has been arranged at the Shitolakshya conference room, icddr,b. The workshop gathered feedback from SRH experts and adolescents on the app's draft content to ensure it meets the needs of this age group. Inputs from parents and teachers were also considered during content development.

A sensitisation workshop on "Assessing Implementation Outcomes of a Cervical Cancer Screening Package in Rural Primary Care Settings of Bangladesh" was held at Baliakandi Upazila Health Complex of Rajbari district.

The event brought together key health sector stakeholders, researchers, and policymakers to discuss the implementation status, challenges, and opportunities of cervical cancer screening at the primary healthcare level in rural areas.

Dr Md. Faruk Hosain, welcomed participants with an opening speech,



while **Prof. Dr Farhana Dewan**, spoke on the current status of Human Papillomavirus (HPV) in Bangladesh. **Dr Quamrun Nahar**, provided insights into the study design and objectives, and **Dr Sabrina Jabeen**, outlined the detailed implementation plan for the cervical cancer screening package. **Prof. Dr Salma Rouf**, spoke passionately about OGSB's ongoing efforts and commitment to combating HPV and cervical cancer in Bangladesh. The event also included an open discussion segment, allowing participants to share feedback, field experiences, and suggestions for



improving screening uptake and service delivery in rural settings.

Dr S. M. Abdullah-al-Murad, delivered the speech as the Chief Guest, emphasising the government's commitment to strengthening preventive healthcare through scalable screening programmes. Dr SM Masud, concluded the session with a closing speech, thanking all participants and urging continued collaboration.
